



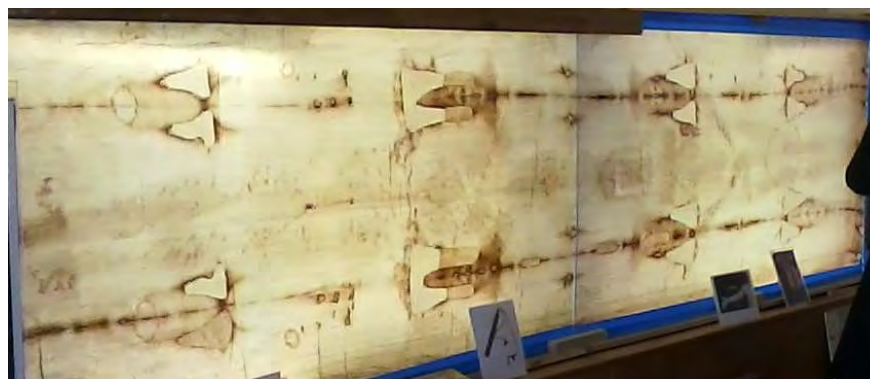

40 Years of Shroud Experience Began at a Meeting in Albuquerque

In 1976, a discovery in Albuquerque of the three-dimensional properties of the Shroud of Turin image, led to the largest scientific expedition ever to study a single artifact. In 1977, Barrie Schwartz was recruited for the team. He was doing photography work for Los Alamos National Laboratory at the time. Barrie is a delightful and engaging speaker. His work has appeared in many TV documentaries and publications worldwide. Amazing photographs tell the story of the New Mexico connection, along with highlights from his Shroud experience.

The Shroud continues to be part of New Mexico history. A full-size image of the Shroud of Turin and other items will be on display, courtesy of the Shroud Exhibit and Museum in Alamogordo, NM. Pete Schumacher, another member of the 1978 investigation team and Founder-President of the Alamogordo museum will also be present to answer questions.
