Papal visit to Juarez: A pilgrim's stop on the way to see Pope Francis?

The Holy Shroud of Turin is considered by most people to be the burial cloth of Jesus. There is a Shroud exhibit located at the junction of Shroud history and New Mexico history in Alamogordo, NM. A proof concerning the Shroud's three-dimensional (3D) properties occurred at Sandia Labs in Albuquerque, NM in 1976. That discovery brought about the world's largest scientific investigation ever launched to study a single artifact. More than 40 people with more than 6000 pounds of equipment went to Turin to examine the Shroud in 1978. The on-site examination was 24 hours per day for five consecutive days. The team was formed in New Mexico in March of 1977. Many of the team members were from New Mexico or were associated with scientific space research in New Mexico.

The museum features videos, posters, images and one presentation in 20 different languages. Admission is free. Bring the family and experience a full-size color image, a 3D interactive display posters, and images, and learn many interesting facts about the Holy Shroud of Turin.
